Now that we're well into Spring and the days are lengthening, several members – including us – have seen quite a bit of hedgehog activity in our gardens. Three individuals have visited us, and occasionally spent the day in our box. We are holding an amount of cash belonging to the Group, and various items for display. Of course we will help the lucky applicant to ease into this highly worthwhile and enjoyable endeavour.

There will be a wildlife display of hedgehogs & wild bees in **The Market Garden** from Tuesday 4th April to promote awareness of these two vulnerable creatures. The display will remain until Easter, so we are producing some of our popular wool hedgehogs in Easter egg colours – "egghogs", see photo below – and these, along with the normal-coloured 'hogs, are priced at £4.00 for the small and £5.00 for the medium. They will be available in the Market Garden. All proceeds go to the Hedgehog Highway fund, so please support the protection of our prickly friends.

Also there will be a display on a similar theme in the **Library** window from Monday 11th April. A childrens' reading time and colour-your-own-hedgehog to take home will be in the Library. Details will be shown in the Library window from Wednesday 13th April.
